






Goal: Update the Website

Concrete Canoe Casting Day

- February 2nd, 2020
- 20 attendees
- Split into two groups: one mixing the concrete and the other casting the canoe using the prior made mold
- The theme was Kanute Rockne after the famous ND football coach
- Green and white concrete was used to make the canoe resemble a football field





Pre and Post Casting Day Meetings

- Final mix meetings for the 2019-2020 canoe to test the mix that was iterated in the fall
- Batching meetings to set aside the materials and streamline the process on casting day
- Final structural meetings to finish the mold as well as demolding meetings after the canoe was cast and set

- Club paid for members to have a fun night bowling with each other





Fall Canoe Meetings

- Preliminary meetings over the summer and early in the semester to plan the canoe and process
- Numerous mix design meetings to iterate and test the proposed mixes
- Weekly virtual meetings over winter break to discuss the next steps and plan the structural components of the canoe





Initial Zoom Meeting

- August 25, 2020
- 21 attendees
- The officers and some of the returning and new ASCE members met briefly over Zoom to discuss the plans for the club for the year. The goal was also to also take any ideas from members about the club during COVID-19





Kickoff Meeting

- September 24, 2020
- 34 attendees
- Our kickoff meeting for the semester took place outside socially distanced on ND's North Quad
- We introduced the officers and gave background for the clubs different activities such as concrete canoe
- As part of an interactive and fun part of the meeting, attendees participated in both a paper airplane and Kahoot Trivia contest with apparel prizes!
